Amending section 23-362, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to **minimum wages**.
23-362. **Minimum wage**; prohibition --Next Hit--
A. The legislature declares that the establishment of a uniform **minimum wage** is a matter of statewide concern. --Next Hit--
B. No political subdivision of this state may establish, mandate or otherwise require a **minimum wage that exceeds the federal minimum wage** prescribed in 29 United States Code section 206. --Next Hit--
C. AN EMPLOYER IN THIS STATE MAY PAY AN EMPLOYEE A **MINIMUM WAGE** THAT IS UP TO THREE DOLLARS PER HOUR LESS THAN THE **MINIMUM WAGE** REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION IF THE EMPLOYEE'S PRIMARY PURPOSE IS THE SERVING OF BEVERAGES AND THE EMPLOYEE CUSTOMARILY AND REGULARLY RECEIVES TIPS OR GRATUITIES FROM CUSTOMERS. THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IF THE EMPLOYER CAN ESTABLISH BY RECORDS OF CHARGED TIPS OR BY THE EMPLOYEE'S DECLARATION FOR FEDERAL INSURANCE CONTRIBUTION PURPOSES THAT FOR EACH WEEK, BY RECEIVED TO WAGES PAID, THE EMPLOYEE RECEIVED AT LEAST THE **MINIMUM WAGE** FOR ALL HOURS WORKED FORTY HOURS PER WEEK AND TIME AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE **MINIMUM WAGE** FOR EVERY HOUR WORKED IN EXCESS OF A FORTY HOUR WORK WEEK. THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT RULES TO ENFORCE THIS SUBSECTION.

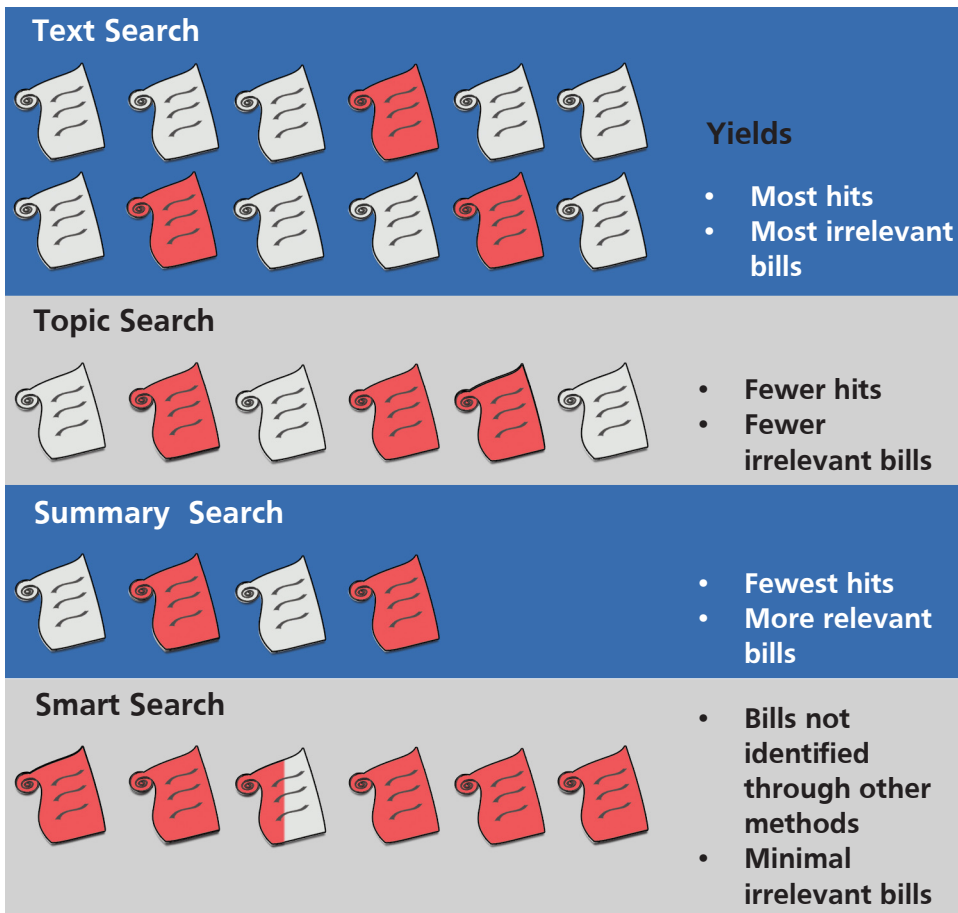
